Military History Essay Contest Rules

The Challenge

The Historical Miniature Game Society - Pacific Southwest (HMGS-PSW) invites Upper Division and Rising Historians to write an essay on a military history topic of their choice.

Deadline

June 30, 2022

Prior Publication

Submissions must be the author's original work, and not previously submitted to the HMGS-PSW Military History Essay Contest. Author's may, however, have submitted their essays as part of their academic course work. Entrants may submit multiple essays, but the judges will select only one winning essay per entrant.

SCHOLARSHIP PRIZES (Two categories)

Upper Division – Current and former college students and ROTC cadets.

The Tim Keenon Grand Prize - \$150, First Prize - \$75, and Second Prize - \$25

Rising Historians – Students under the age of eighteen, grouped as JROTC, high, middle, and elementary school students.

Winners will receive gifts cards donated by our generous Corporate sponsors.

ALL WINNERS RECEIVE

1. A prepaid Family Admission (up to four entrants) to HWGS-PSW Mini-Wars 2022 on Saturday or Sunday (an approximate \$50 value).
2. Scholar Division papers that meet the minimum requirements outlined in Appendix A are eligible for publication in The Saber and Scroll, the history journal of the American Public University / American Military University. Now published by Westphalia Press, The Saber and Scroll Journal is available in 28,000 college and university libraries worldwide.

Submission Guidelines

- i. Manuscripts should be written using Microsoft Word with a title page. The narrative, and any notes, are to be in 12-point Times New Roman, numbered, and double-spaced with a one-inch margin on all sides.
- ii. Do not include your name on the title page or within the essay.
- iii. On a separate cover-sheet, include the essay category (Upper Division or Rising Historian w/ grade level) with the title and author's name, email address, phone number, and school affiliation.
- iv. Essays and cover-sheet should be emailed to jeff.ballard.hb.ca@gmail.com before the deadline for consideration.

Judging

Essays will be judged against others from the same age groups on the following criteria:

- a. Essay's success in proving the author's thesis;
- b. Readability;
- c. The thoroughness of research;
- d. Quality of insights based on historical events; and
- e. Uniqueness/novelty of ideas presented.

All essays will be judged in the blind. A panel of distinguished judges will select winning essays. We reserve the right to stop accepting essays once submissions reach 200 per division.

Appendix A

The Saber and Scroll Journal is a quarterly, student run publication that welcomes submissions from graduate and undergraduate students, as well as alumni from any institution. The Journal will consider submissions on any history or military history topic. Our latest issue Winter 2021 can be browsed here: <https://saberandscroll.scholasticahq.com/issue/3881>.

Manuscript submissions must adhere to the following: The length of the manuscript should be between 6,000 and 7,000 words, not including front or back matter, and prepared using MS Word. The narrative and notes are to be in 12-point Times New Roman, numbered, and double-spaced with a one-inch margin on all sides. The citation style for the Journal is the latest edition of Chicago-Turabian, using end-notes.

The manuscript and cover page need to be submitted separately so that we can protect the fairness of the double-blind peer-review process. The cover sheet must include the name, affiliation, mailing, and email address of the author along with a statement that the manuscript has not been previously published and has not been submitted for publication elsewhere.

Each submission must also include a 100-150 word abstract and a list of 8-10 keywords on the first page of the manuscript.
